Planning for 2020

It is hard to believe that the final term is upon us! Our enrolments numbers are growing and we are in the process of determining how many classes are expected in 2020. To assist us in this process, please notify the office if you are not planning to return to Miranda North in 2020, so that enrolment numbers can be finalised and planning for classes can be undertaken. Additionally, if circumstances are that your child will not be in attendance in the first week of school next year, an application for leave needs to be completed prior to the end of the year. This allows us to include your child in the enrolment numbers for 2020 if they have not yet returned from an extended holiday.

Class formations in 2020

In 2020, we are expecting to form 14 or 15 classes, depending on final student numbers. As our anticipated student numbers are very close to the 15th class, when students return on the first day in 2020, they will commence the school day in their 2019 class. This allows time for the school to finalise enrolment numbers and determine how many classes will be formed for the year. This is common practice in many schools and students enjoy the opportunity to regroup with their teachers and classmates and refresh their learning and expectations for the year. Once class numbers are finalised, students will be placed into classes accordingly.

If parents and carers have specific information about their child that they wish to be taken into account when planning for classes takes place, please provide the information to the school office in writing. This information is treated with confidentiality. Many factors are taken into account when placing students into classes and information all provided considered, specific requests may not be possible. Student learning and wellbeing needs are of the highest priority when placing students into classes and the staff works to build classes that promote a successful environment for learning.

Key Information:

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2021 must be made online between 8 October 2019 and 11 November 2019. Late applications will not be accepted.

Parents must apply online at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7 All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on 12 March 2020. A note to all year 5 students has gone out at the beginning of term.


