COVID-19 update

Parents and carers and other non-essential visitors are not allowed on the school site. Parents should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable them to physically distance from one another and from staff. Drop off and pick up arrangements at the school remain the same with parents waiting in the designated grass or asphalt areas for students to be dismissed. Kindergarten transition program

Our kindergarten transition program commenced this week with our first information session for families. Thank you to Mrs O'Connell and the kindergarten team for their flexibility and effort in planning for a differentiated transition program for 2020. Our newest students will be visiting for their first time a little later in the term. Our stage three students are also very excited about taking on a buddy role next year and we look forward to welcoming all new students and their families to Miranda North.

Class formations in 2021

In 2021, we are expecting to form either 14 or 15 classes, depending on the actual student numbers who attend at the commencement of the new school year. In some years, the number of classes can be confidently determined the year before, as a small difference in student numbers may not result in a reduction or addition of a class. In other years, like the last 2 school years at Miranda North, the enrolment numbers are very much on the margin of either forming an extra class or reducing the total number of classes by one and as such, a small fluctuation of student numbers will impact the total number of classes in the school. Schools are experienced in managing this variable and there a couple of helpful ways that families can assist.

Firstly, to assist us in finalising the number of classes and staff we will have for 2021, please notify the office via email if you are not planning to return to Miranda North next year (excluding year 6 students), so that enrolment numbers can be more confidently determined and planning for classes can be undertaken.

Additionally, if circumstances are that your child will not be in attendance in the first week of school next year, an application for leave needs to be completed prior to the end of the year. This allows us to include your child in the enrolment numbers for 2021 if they have not yet returned to school.

As our anticipated student numbers could be either 14 or 15 classes, when students return on the first day in 2021, they will commence the school day in their 2020 class. This allows time for the school to finalise enrolment numbers and determine how many classes will be formed for the year. This is common practice in many schools and students enjoy the opportunity to regroup with their teachers and classmates and refresh their learning and expectations for the year. Once class numbers are finalised, students will be placed into classes accordingly.

New return to school date for students in 2021:

Please note that the Department of Education has issued an updated return to school date for students in 2021. Students will commence on Friday 29 January, 2021. Teachers return on Wednesday 27 January, 2021 for 2 school development days.

Sharing information for consideration during class formation:

If parents and carers have specific information about their child that they wish to be taken into account when planning for classes takes place, please provide the information via the school email. This information is treated with confidentiality. Many factors are taken into account when placing students into classes and information provided by parents and carers is considered during the planning process. Student learning and wellbeing needs are of the highest priority when placing students into classes and the staff works to build classes that promote a successful environment for learning. If you have extenuating circumstances and wish to provide information for consideration, it needs to be provided to the school email by 15 November, 2020.

Welcome to Mrs Jenny Lawson

In 2021, we will welcome Mrs Jenny Lawson as one of the assistant principals at Miranda North. Mrs Lawson was successful through merit selection and is currently the assistant principal at Malabar Public School. She brings with her a wealth of experience and expertise and we are excited to welcome her to the school. Mrs Lawson will visit the school throughout term 4 and will commence in term 1, 2021.

Staffing updates—Term 4

Seeking your input and feedback for our new school planning cycle

Next year marks the commencement of a new school planning cycle, one which will run from 2021-2024. In 2022, the school will also undertake an external validation process. This will be where the school undertakes an external validation of evidence of our school self-assessment. The school will engage in discussions with an external panel and have our self-assessments validated using the School Excellence Framework.

Each year, we undertake a self-assessment of practice and development, using the School Excellence Framework to identify areas of strength and areas to improve. The School Excellence Framework is a statement of what is valued as excellence for NSW public schools, both now and into the future, and provides guidance on achieving this. It identifies quality practice across the three key domains of learning, teaching and leading.

Community engagement is a critical factor for improving the progress, achievement and wellbeing of our students. When schools, families and the broader community work together to develop positive connections, students thrive. There will be an opportunity a little later in the term for a zoom parent consultation meeting where we will share our school progress data collected over recent months, our school targets for student learning improvement and seek your input towards our school vision and direction for 2021-2024.
