Principal's Report

It was lovely to return to the school last week having been traveling through Canada over the last month. I had the opportunity to work with the University of BC and the University of Ottawa looking at the education systems in their provinces, Indigenous Education and Leadership. Several of the days were also spent visiting schools in Vancouver and Ottawa. It is pleasing to recognise that we in Miranda North PS and the NSW System in general is equal and in some ways even leading in the teaching and learning that occurs elsewhere.

Over the past 2 weeks we have had several Miranda North students perform at exceptionally high levels in music and sport. Congratulations to Alex S who performed at the Conservatorium of Music as part of Sydney Southwest Symphonic Winds. Lilly-Grace R whose team won the Australian Oz Tag championships for her age group. Congratulations to Jael M and Cruz C who have been selected in the Oz Tag City team to compete in November. We also congratulate Ben G, Kyan R and Austin P who competed in the PSSA State competition for Cricket. The boys had been selected in the Sydney East Team and finished 4th overall. We have many students who are achieving great things across all facets of their educational lives and we are proud of all of them.

Thank you to Mrs Butterfield for her leadership while I was on leave and for all the work the staff continue to do to make this school one that offers quality schooling for the whole child. This week we will hold our first Kinder Orientation program for the 2023 cohort. We have almost 50 students attending Miranda North next year. 

Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2024, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply and the link to the online form will be available in early-October 2022 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

Applications open on 18 October 2022 and close on 16 November 2022. You must apply before the closing date.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.

In Weeks 1 and 2 we will be learning about:


Mindset and the different mindsets we can adopt throughout life.
