Principal's Report

Last week was our School Open Day and Book Week celebrations. As a Teacher/Principal of more than 35 years I believe that the event was one of the best that I have ever been a part of. The effort and engagement of the students and their families to create, dress up and participate in the Character Parade was terrific. The morning performances and open classrooms was a credit to our students and staff. For many families, it was the first real opportunity to return and explore the school in almost three years. For some of our newer families it was the first time to actually look around the school. It was wonderful to host such a successful day for our community and I would like to recognise the work that went into the day by the school staff and highlight my appreciation of their efforts.

This week I have had several meetings with Asset Management, looking at the maintenance of the school in the next financial year and also the projects that are currently underway. It appears we will have many rooms getting new carpet, inside and outside painting, repairs to walls and damaged doors. We look forward to these upgrades being completed and the improvements they will bring to the school. The walkways are progressing with roof framing being undertaken. In regard to the asphalting, the next steps will start on Monday, 29 September with the area next to K/1L and OOSH. On Monday, 12 September, the main playground will be fenced off providing a narrow area for classes to enter rooms. This will be a big project taking 4 weeks and will see the assembly area move to the hall in the morning and the play areas on the grass rather than the COLA. Small pain for large gain! The benefits will be great when this area is returned to us completed.

Crossing Safety

I would like to remind families to emphasise the safety with their children regarding road crossings. At the front of the school we have very specific rules to ensure the safety of the students crossing at the lights. However, alarmingly over recent weeks adults with their children have started moving in front of the yellow marked line. Some students with parents have been playing with balls close to the road which is extremely dangerous, staff have also witnessed some students taking risks crossing the road, running or going against the lights. We have addressed this with the children and would appreciate the importance of road safety being reinforced at home.

I would like to express my appreciation to Shellie M who held the role of Fundraising Coordinator. Her dedication to supporting the P&C and the school has been admirable. Most recently, the P&C Fundraising through the Trivia Night was a great example where everyone had a great time.
