





Principal's Report


As we pass the half way mark of term 4 the school continues to be very active in all fields. Classes are working hard, assessments, both formative and summative are being conducted and concepts within their stages of learning continue to be explored. Teachers are working on student reports that will be sent home on Friday 9 December. We have many activities coming up including Grandparent's Day on Wednesday, 30 November with a concert starting at 9.45am, Gala Day, Year 6 Farewell and Presentation Day. Please see upcoming dates further in this newsletter.

The school has seen excellent growth in student performances, data was presented to the P&C meeting last week. Check-in Assessments for year 4 and 6 show significant growth across 2022. Although all grades completed the Department of Education Check-in Assessments recently, only Year 4 and 6 completed the assessments in term 1. However clearly the growth in academic performance for both groups has been consistent in both Reading and Numeracy. Year 3 and 5 results show that we sit above the state average in these assessments. It is however the ability to look at the performance of the students across the two assessments in Year 4 and 6 that show the movement from below state average to above with a growth of around 6-8 %. The Graphs below are for Numeracy for Term 1 and 4. The data is Term 4 scores.

This is supported by the pre and post assessments that the school conducts with our math groups across all year 3-6 classes. The differentiation of learning within classes is providing the opportunity for students to be catered for both in scaffolded learning support and high potential and gifted students.

In 2022 three of our year 6 students received offers to their first choice for selective high school whilst the Opportunity Class offers recently revealed that we had one student offered a position and two students placed on the reserve list. A very good outcome for our school.

Tell Them From Me Survey Results

Recently the survey closed and has been analysed. The parent survey saw 50 responses from our community. Several themes came through the survey responses and we will use these to look at how we can improve the experience at Miranda North and serve our community. Sadly, we have significantly underperformed according to the measures in the survey of Parents which are represented below.

Results from the Student surveys were far more positive. Strong rises in the trend lines for 'Sense of Belonging' and good growth for 'Values School Outcomes, Positive Behaviour and Interest and Motivation'. The trend for Bullying is also positive as there was no recorded rise for the respondents and it is significantly below the state average.



With the return from restrictions it is good to see significant participation in sport and extracurricular activities. In 2023 we will continue the PSSA sport program which is competitive but also ensure that we have Gala Day programs which are all about involvement. We utilised the Australian Sporting Schools program that provide opportunities for learning about other sports, such as this year's hockey program and the Frisbee program. We will continue to participate in this program in 2023.

The school will have a dedicated Visual Arts program operating as part of the teachers release from face-to-face teaching. As the school looks at all high performance and gifted students across all cohorts enhancing the schools teaching to ensure we are providing opportunities and catering to the needs of our students.

Update on maintenance and playground upgrades.

This program has been a long time through completion, significantly affected by weather. The asphalt works are nearly finished with the final areas due to be laid during the Christmas holidays, between buildings and the asphalt leading to the grass area. Drainage works will also be completed to address flooding issues at school. New playground markings have been installed on the asphalt area nearest the road for the K/1 students with a further installation under the COLA coming in the next few weeks.

Covered Walkways will also be completed before the end of the school year. The roofing contractor is due to start next week with deliveries of material. Although the school had little to do with the positioning of walkways, it will provide a significant improvement for getting around the school. As a result of this work, we will also have a sheltered area for student bikes at the back of the 3/4 classrooms.
