Principal's Report

During Term 4 the school will be examining the programs and practices conducted at school to develop a new school plan for 2024-2028. This follows the External Validation conducted in Term 2 of the school for which the previous school plan was a significant part for the directions of learning. We value and welcome community consultation, into the new School Plan and as such, I will be conducting some surveys, face to face discussions and working with the P&C to get their input. The first of these surveys is the Tell Them From Me Survey, conducted annually. Last year the responses led to the introduction of Jellybeans Music, various school improvements and provided us with insight into considered strengths and areas where improvements could be made. Parents please have a talk with your children, as we come to the end of the term, there have been some significant behaviours in the last few weeks on the playground as the children interact. We need your support to stop this behaviour. In particular, games around the grass playing areas, need to be 5 metres off the fence line. This is easy, as there are gardens planted around the boundary. Students need to stop at the gardens and not continue through or to the fence with their games. Our neighbours have complained about fences being consistently hit by balls and even kicked by the students. There has also been too many instances of rough play at school. There is no slide tackling in soccer and no tackling in football. Students come to these games with a wide ability and the games here at lunch/recess are for fun not competition.

Some of the rough play involves students jumping on and wrestling with their friends. This is often resulting in injuries which although not deliberate, are predictable outcomes from the behaviours. Again, teachers on duty are trying to keep everyone safe but we need the support of parents to emphasise the importance of following the school rules.

I am hopeful that Term 4 will start better than term 3 has ended.

Mr Angus will be on leave 09/10 – 13/10 (Week 1). Mrs Ferlazzo will be Relieving Principal for the week.


Principal's Report
